The membership figures for the last year have again shown an encouraging increase in both the numbers of youth members and adults. However, the availability of adults both as leaders and administrators remains crucial to the continuing success of Scouting in Cardiff and The Vale of Glamorgan and the search for and recruitment of suitable adults will continue to be a key objective in the forthcoming year.

The Executive has taken a close interest in a number of issues and, in particular, the provision of a high standard of training for leaders and non-uniformed members at district and group level. The issue of how this should be paid for is currently the subject of a consultation process, and we hope to be able to put forward firm proposals to members before the end of the summer.

Amongst the various grants it has made, the Executive has also provided a loan to St Brides to enable the potential redevelopment of the old Scout Hall into a District Activity Centre to be explored and for Scouting to regain its foothold in the western fringes of the Area.

We would like to pay tribute to the 'hidden army' of folk who work tirelessly as supporters and helpers in Groups and Districts, and to Fay Harding-Lewis for her hard work in dealing with Area matters and keeping The Hub running smoothly. It continues to provide a well-used and valuable resource for adult training and activities, as continues to provide a successful venue for private hire.

Following another active year we are grateful for those who ensure that a wide and diversified programme is provided for all our members. This includes our campsites at Jubilee and Miskin, the Activities Team, (Hill walking, water, archery, Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and target shooting) Gang Show, Swimming Gala, Scout Post and Training. It is only the dedication and commitment of all our outstanding leaders and adults that makes Scouting possible.

The Scouts Wales Outdoor Activity Weekend held at St Fagans National History Museum, Cardiff with its "Urban Adventure," and the Sea Scout event in Barry were very memorable, successful and worthwhile events. Everyone enjoyed the experiences on offer and it was pleasing to see that all the Scout sections Beavers, Cubs, Scout, Explorer Scouts and Network, supported by their Leaders, participated in a range of activities whilst having the opportunity to meet and socialise with other members of the Scout Association in the Area. Our Chief Scout, Bear Grylls attended and this added to the enjoyment and sense of occasion. It allowed young people to go outdoors, do things and have fun, which is what it is all about! Our thanks to everyone who participated, planned, facilitated and contributed to these brilliant and unforgettable events held within Cardiff and Vale of Glamorgan.

Congratulations to all those who lead, supported and contributed to the successful Cardiff Gang Show in November 2012, which has been recognised by gaining a prestigious national award. The Cardiff Scout & Guide Gang Show was the National Operatic and Dramatic Association Wales and Ireland District Winners in the Best Youth Production 2012 category with their presentation of "The Magic Walking Stick."

Many members also serve on Area committees and some take on additional responsibilities as chairs, treasurers or secretaries, without whose help our work with young people would be impossible. As an Area, we are very fortunate to have such colleagues, who bring a wealth of expertise and common sense to our work to support Scouting. 



- During the year, 45 wood badges were awarded, well done to all those who have worked so hard to achieve this.






For our eighth consecutive year we have increased our overall youth membership by 5.64% making a total of 3,243 members. The Network section for a second year have a record increase of 36.36% from 33 members in 2012 to 45 in 2013.

Sectional Membership



Youth membership spans from 6 to 25 years, enabling 19 years of Scouting. Most of our youth membership comes from our two youngest sections, Cubs (34.35%) and Beavers (28.53%).
